Decorating Candles

Candle with Inscription

You need

- STOCKMAR Modelling Beeswax or Modelling Wax in the colours white and green
- 1 dark-coloured candle, e.g. blue,
 70 x Ø 75 mm
- · A knife
- Sticking Wax
- **1-** Before decorating, rub the surface of the candle with a cloth (see TIP).
- 2- It's very easy to make letters with Modelling Wax. You shape thin rolls of wax and flatten them somewhat with your finger, cutting more finely with the knife if desired. Shape the letters into the desired form and press onto the candle.



3- Make four heart-shaped cloverleaves from the green Modelling Wax and a small roll for the stem. Bend the stem and press onto the candle. Curl the cloverleaves a bit inwards and attach to the end of the stem with Sticking Wax.

Candle with Leftover Modelling Wax




You need

- Leftover pieces of coloured STOCKMAR Modelling Beeswax or Modelling Wax
- 1 white candle, e.g. 130 x ø 50 mm
- 1- Before decorating, rub the candle with a cloth (see TIP next side). Warm leftover pieces of Modelling Wax in your hands, break off small pieces and press onto the candle at random. In the example pictured, the spots towards the bottom of the candle are closer together, then gradually become more spread out towards the top (Dia. 1).

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Modelling Wax





Stearin and paraffin candles are often coated with a shiny film when purchased. It's therefore recommended to rub a candle firmly with a cloth before decorating. The Modelling Wax then adheres better.



You need

- STOCKMAR Modelling Beeswax or Modelling Wax in the colours yellow, orange, white and light blue
- 1 dark-coloured candle, e.g. violet,
 70 x ø 75 mm
- A knife
- 1- Before decorating, rub the candle with a cloth (see TIP). The splendid-looking candle can be made very simply. The shapes used are small dots, semi-circles, drops and imprinted bands.
- 2- For the yellow and white dots, make small balls and flatten with your finger. If the dot is too big, cut off a bit with the knife and begin again.



- **3-** Make the semi-circles like the dots and cut them in half. Make the drops like the dots and then shape into the form of a drop.
- 4- The bands are made from narrow rolls. It's easier to attach two or three pieces to each other than to work on one long piece. Position the rolls on the candle and make imprints with the match, pressing on at the same time.
